Bristol Insight


The fam trip ends here but for those who would like to continue their day in Bristol, tickets will be provided to the 'hop on, hop off' Bristol Insight bus tour.

Alternatively transport back to Holland House will be provided for check out and travel home.





Getting around

↑ On foot

Bristol City Centre is a great place to discover on foot and has a number of distinctive areas to explore. Many of Bristol's attractions are a short distance from The Central Promenade (K5), which is approximately 15 minutes walk from Temple Meads Station (R6) and under 10 minutes from the Bus & Coach Station (M2).

If you are here to **shop**, the main areas to head for are Broadmead (N3), Cabot Circus (N2), Park Street (H4), the West End (F3), St. Nicholas Markets (M4) and Clifton (C4). A Shopmobility service is provided at the Cabot Circus Car Park.

You will find plenty of places to stop for a drink or something to eat throughout the central area including Harbourside, the Old City and the West End. Look out for local markets that take place regularly throughout the year.

An excellent way to see the city is to follow the footpaths alongside the Floating Harbour or walk to the top of Brandon Hill (F4), off Park Street, which offers a panoramic view of the city. Parts of Bristol are hilly, so if you are planning to visit Clifton Village, the Suspension Bridge, Bristol Zoo Gardens or the Downs you may find it easier to catch a bus.

By bike

shops and libraries have cycle maps. Bikes can be hired from a variety of businesses across the city, details can be found at www.betterbybike.info

By bus

Bristol's bus network can help you explore different parts of the city. For a journey planner to get you from A to B, or to find out more about stops for a particular location or area in the city, go to www.travelwest.info and click on the journey planner.

The 8 service runs on a circular route including Temple Meads Railway Station, the Centre Promenade (for theatres and harbourside), Bristol Zoo Gardens and Clifton Village.

The 70 and 73 offer services from Temple Meads Railway Station to the central area, then onwards to the north of the city and the 72 from Temple Meads to UWE Frenchay Campus via the University of Bristol and Park Street.

Bristol Insight offer open top bus tours around the city allowing you to hop on and off and visit the city's main attractions with their popular Explorer tickets valid for two consecutive days. Please check their website for full timetables and stops www.bristolinsight.co.uk

Park and Ride Services run from the Portway (North West of the city, convenient for M5 J18), Brislington (South East) and Long Ashton (South West)

The Airport Flyer express bus service connects central Bristol (including Bristol Temple Meads and Bristol Bus Bristol offers cycle routes throughout the city and most bike Station) with Bristol Airport. For more information visit flyer.bristolairport.co.uk

By ferry

Ferries operate daily throughout the year. Stops include Temple Meads Station, Castle Park for Broadmead and Cabot Circus, The Centre Promenade, and ss Great Britain. You can also relax on a round trip of the harbour or enjoy special cruises along the river. Times are shown at the landing stages. By train

Temple Meads Station (R6), a major hub for the national rail network, is approximately 15 minutes walk from The Centre Promenade. There are frequent trains to **Bath** which is approximately 15 minutes by train. Bristol's other main train station **Parkway** is in the north of the city. There are also services to local stations allowing you to explore the city including Clifton Down, Redland, Montpelier and Stapleton Road. For timetables visit www.nationalrail.co.uk or call National Rail Enquiries on 08457 48 49 50 for information.

Blue badge holders can park for free in any on-street pay and display bay. The Galleries Car Park (N3) has level access to shopping. Shopmobility is located in the car park for Cabot Circus (R2).
