

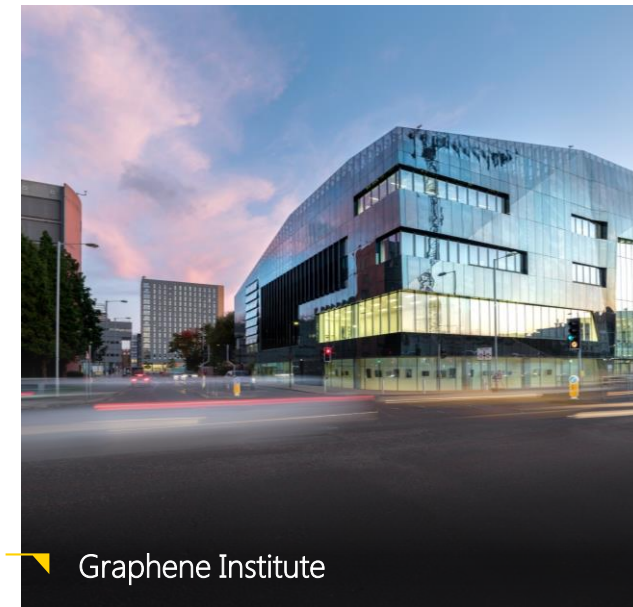
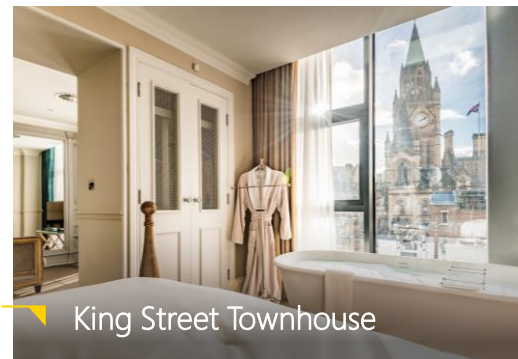

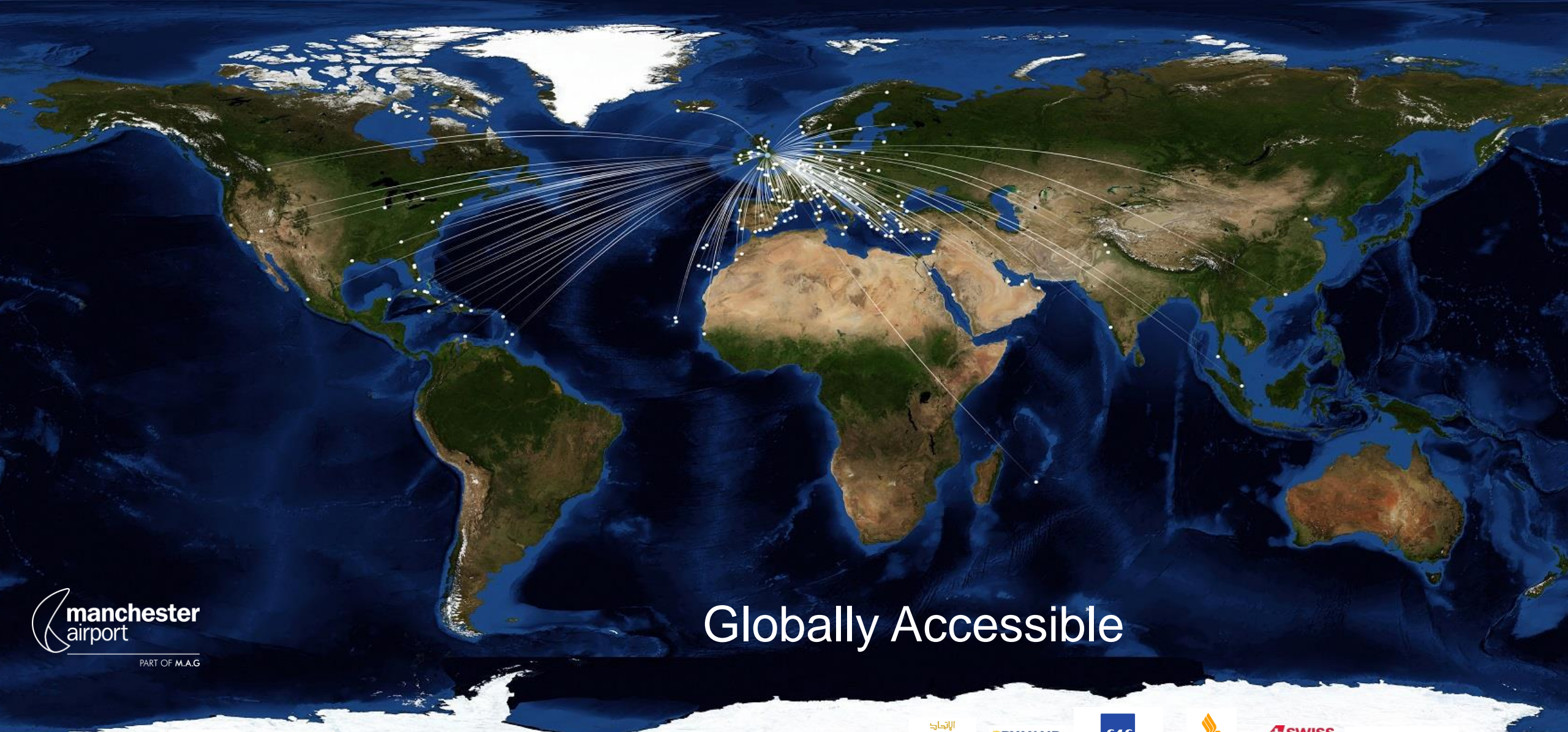

MANCHESTER'S NEIGHBOURHOODS

Ancoats: Set around Cutting Room Square, Ancoats is filled with independent cafes and bars, as well as new restaurants to satisfy any palette.

Castlefield: The Roman heart of the city. Escape from the hustle of city life in Castlefield, with an array of waterside restaurants, pubs and bars.

Central Retail District: The area fulfils all shopping needs, from high-end to high street fashion, and is a popular stage for buskers and street artists.

Chinatown: The second largest Chinatown in the UK, with a wide choice of quality East Asian restaurants, bakeries and shops.

Civic Quarter: Home to iconic listed buildings such as the Town Hall and Central Library. Daily walking tours depart from Central Library at 11:00am.

Oxford Road Corridor: An area of knowledge-intensive, entrepreneurial and cultural organisations, where world-changing ideas are generated and realised.

First Street: One of Manchester's cultural districts, First Street is home to the multi-arts centre HOME, as well as bars, restaurants and accommodation.

Greengate: In the heart of Manchester, blending heritage, culture, commercial spaces and residential buildings with a water-front setting.

Medieval Quarter: Rich in culture and history, and home to some of the city's oldest buildings, such as Manchester Cathedral and Cheetham's Library.

New Bailey: An up-and-coming vibrant riverside area of the city, which mixes commercial space with accommodation, restaurants, pubs and bars.

NOMA: With places to live, work, eat and drink, this growing neighbourhood is now home to Sadler's Yard, PlantNOMA and The Pilcrow Pub.

Northern Quarter: The city's creative neighbourhood, filled with independent retailers of vintage fashion, music, art and much more.

Petersfield: Manchester's conference district including Manchester Central Convention Complex, the Bridgewater Hall and Great Northern.

Piccadilly: The main gateway into the city including Piccadilly train station. Shops, restaurants, bars, pubs and hotels surround Piccadilly Gardens.

Spinningfields: A vibrant destination with luxury international fashion brands and an impressive number of restaurants and bars.

St. John's: Home to the Museum of Science and Industry, this unique community encourages creativity and enterprise in an ever evolving world.

The Gay Village: Centred around vibrant Canal Street, this area of the city offers a unique atmosphere with plenty of restaurants, bars, pubs and clubs.
